Witnessing an overdose?

Call 911 and stay with the person

- 1. Always Have Naloxone:** Inform friends, family, and anyone you use with that you have naloxone and where it's kept. Make sure they know how to use it.
- 2. Don't Use Alone:** If you must use alone, call an Overdose Prevention Hotline (listed to the left). They will stay on the line with you and call emergency services if you don't respond after using. Save these hotline numbers in your phone. Share them with others.
- 3. Test for Fentanyl:** If you have fentanyl test strips, use them on heroin, cocaine, methamphetamine, and counterfeit pills. If the test is positive, consider not using or use a smaller or more diluted amount. Test strips aren't 100% accurate. Always have naloxone.
- 4. Inform Others Before Using:** Tell others where naloxone is and to give it and call 911 if someone overdoses. Georgia law protects you from arrest or prosecution if you call 911 for an overdose and stay with the victim.
- 5. Go Slow:** Start with a very small amount of any drug to test its strength. If injecting, inject a little first and wait 20 seconds to gauge its effect. If it feels off, consider not using it or using less. You can always use more.

Georgia law does not provide immunity for calling 911 if you have outstanding warrants. It also does not address immunity for people with illegal immigration status. If possible, have a person who does not have outstanding warrants or illegal immigration status call 911 and stay at the scene with the victim.
